
IX. ANNOTATED APPENDICES

During the planning process for the Lumber Heritage Region, extensive background research was conducted on project-related resources within the region. APPENDIX A: PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND PLANNING PROCESS:

Planning the LHR included public participation through an Advisory and Core Steering Committee comprised of a wide array of stakeholders. This section details the planning process and highlights specific types of public participation and outreach during this process.

APPENDIX B: HISTORIC CONTEXTS
